We certainly had our own version of “March Madness”, starting with impressive performances by our two jazz ensembles at The Head of the Lakes Jazz Festival at UMD on March 9th.

Next up was the MSHSL music contest held once again at UMD on March 18th and 19th. The concert band earned three Superior ratings with scores of 39, 39, and 38 (out of 40) on Division 1 music. The judges for the band were Mark Whitlock (UMD Band Director), Pam Bustos (UWS Band Director) and John Hussy (Retired Band Director). The Jazz Ensemble One also earned a Superior rating with the score of 40. Not to be outdone, Hannah Erickson with accompanist Josie Stracek also scored a perfect 40 on her flute solo. She also received best performance of the day from her judge. That is quite a feather in her cap.

All of the following groups earned a Superior rating: Jake Siptroth and Bethany Kemi scored a 39 on their flute duet. Whitney Carlson and Katie Boettcher scored 38 on their clarinet duet. The sax quintet comprised of Jace Brademan, Jennah Calverly, Isaiah Salinas, Zach Liupakka, and Matt Sunde scored a 38. The Trumpet quartet with Will Omberg, Jacob Laundergan, Josh Liupakka, and Austin Pera scored a 35.

The Flute trio received an Excellent rating with a 33 score. The players were Chloe Fredrickson, Emily Saphner, and Kelsey Rye. They were accompanied by Katie Boettcher on the piano.

The pep band was very busy performing at 10 games between March 2nd and 23rd. The Girls and Boys Basketball teams made for many bus trips to UMD and Minneapolis. In fact, the last game was on Saturday morning on March 23rd, the same day that we left on our band trip to New York City.

From March 23rd through the 29th, 53 band students traveled first to Cleveland, Ohio then to NYC, and finally Chicago. Check out our Facebook page “Esko Band Trip” to see many pictures. It was truly a wonderful trip with great kids, great events, and great chaperones. You will see photos of the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame, Statue of Liberty, Broadway, Radio City Music Hall, Times Square, boat trip, United Nations, Intrepid, Central Park, the “Bean”, and many more.

The Band concert on April 9 was well attended and received. We heard great comments about all of the groups and the kids felt that they created a memorable performance. Highlights from the evening were The Last Stagecoach Heist (7th), Lord of the Rings (Junior Band), and Lion King (Senior Band). The Senior Band also played music from Wicked and Phantom of the Opera, the other two Broadway shows that they attended in NYC. On Friday, April 26th UMD Jazz 1 under the direction of Ryan Frane will be performing in the Theater at 12:30. This is part of a multi-day recruiting and performance tour around the state.

On Monday, April 29 our Jazz Bands will be playing our fourth annual Big Band Dance, this year it will be at Grandma’s Sports Garden in Duluth from 6 pm to 9 pm. This is a fundraiser for the Esko Music Boosters. Tickets are sold at the door \$10/person and \$30/family. There will be a pizza buffet and silent auction. Buffet prices: \$9.99/Adults and \$6.99/ages 6-12 and free for ages 5 and under. 
Our elementary concert is scheduled for Thursday, May 9th starting at 6:30 pm.

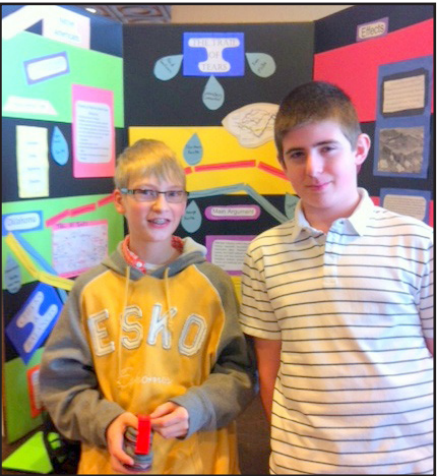

NATIONAL HISTORY DAY

Nine Esko students participated in the Northeast Minnesota National History Day competition on Saturday, March 16, at UMD. These students truly MADE history by being the first students in Esko history to participate in this program.

The students worked in groups of 2-5 students. They chose a topic in history and then related that topic to the year’s theme, which was “Turning Points”. Students needed

to prove why their topic was a turning point in history. The topics chosen by the groups included the dropping of the first atomic bomb, the 19th Amendment (Women’s Right to Vote), and The Trail of Tears. The groups then developed exhibits supporting their thesis statements. They also wrote process papers with annotated bibliographies showing what resources they used in developing their exhibits.

Fargo, N.D., April 19, 2013 – Joyce Bergstedt, program facilitator and career center/volunteer coordinator at Esko Public Schools, has been named a Distinguished Education Professional by North Dakota State University. She was one of seven professionals to receive the new award April 19.

The Distinguished Education Professional award recognizes Minnesota and North Dakota high school educators who are advocates of access to higher education and who work effectively with the NDSU Office of Admission.

“These educators play an incredibly important role in supporting access to higher education, which is at the heart of NDSU’s land-grant mission,” said NDSU President Dean L. Bresciani. “Their knowledge of programs and resources at colleges and universities helps stu-

dents see what is possible. We want to recognize them for the outstanding support they give their students and representatives from NDSU who work with their schools.”

Recipients were nominated by Office of Admission staff based on leadership, commitment and excellence in supporting access to higher education and support of NDSU’s recruiting efforts.

Bergstedt was nominated for creating an environment where students are well prepared for the college search process and for visits from college representatives.

“Consider all your options” is her advice to students. “Find a school and career that is a fit for you. This may take some time, and that’s OK. Be prepared to take responsibility for your post-secondary education or career.”

Bergstedt has worked in education for 15 years. She holds a bachelor’s degree in business education.

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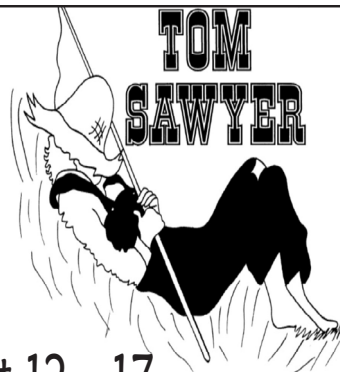

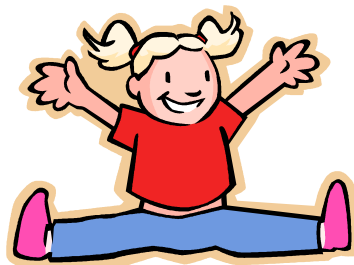

It is hard to believe that there is roughly one month of school left. It has been a fantastic year so far! Let's continue to work together to make this last month of school a great one for our families, students, and staff.

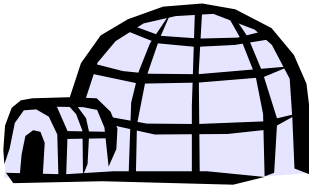
Next Year

MINUTES TOWN BOARD MEETING MARCH 7, 2013

Chairperson Hill called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. in the Town Board Room at the Town Hall.

Janke made a motion to accept the minutes of the previous meeting. Second by Gerard. Motion carried.

Gerard made a motion to approve the vouchers in the amount of \$41,925.44 (Check #'s 38229-38268), to pay payroll and due bills and electronic payments in the amount of \$ 5,776.76. Second by Sunnarborg. Motion carried.

The proposed levy for 2014 was reviewed by the Board. A 3 % increase is being proposed over the 2013 levy. Increases will be made to Road & Bridge, Town Hall, Police, Fire, Capital Improvements, Recreation, Animal Control and Debt Service. A reduction will be made to the General Fund in the amount of \$ 18,730. The total proposed levy amount to be presented at the annual meeting on March 12 will be \$ 1,389,481.00.

Discussion was held on the amount paid annually to Cloquet Area Fire District and Carlton Fire Department for ambulance service.

At 7:00 p.m. a motion was made by Janke with a second by Gerard to recess the regular meeting and convene the Board of Audit. Motion carried.

Peleski presented the 2012 Annual Statement for review and approval.

A motion was made by Sunnarborg with a second by Janke to approve the 2012 Annual Statement as presented by the Clerk. Motion carried.

The 2012 audited financial statement is not yet complete for approval.

At 7:10 p.m. a motion was made by Gerard with a second by Janke to adjourn the Board of Audit and reconvene the regular meeting. Motion carried.

A letter was received from the Esko Soccer Association regarding the use of Northridge Park for the 4-6 year old soccer teams. With construction going on this summer at the regular fields, additional space is needed. Questions were asked such as who would do the mowing. Gerard and Compo will schedule a meeting with soccer representatives.

Gerard reported on a meeting he had with a Minnesota Power representative regarding the placement of the Safe Routes to Schools path along W Highway 61. Discussion was held on the cost involved to move the power poles and an alternative placement.

Janke reported on Community Education activities including the upcoming "Carlton County's Got Talent" contest.

Hill reported on the recent Esko Community Development meeting. There is a grant available that would help fund improvements made to Northridge Park. There's also a grant from Arrowhead Regional Development Corporation that would help the Town update the comprehensive land use plan. These will both be looked at further.

Sunnarborg reported that there are unusually high flow levels at the Helberg Road lift station at the end of the month for the past few months. This will be watched more closely.

A motion was made by Sunnarborg with a second by Gerard to approve the mutual aid agreement with the Carlton County Chiefs' Association of behalf of the Fire Department. Motion carried.

Chairperson Hill called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. in the Town Board Room at the Town Hall.

Janke made a motion to accept the minutes of the previous meeting. Second by Gerard. Motion carried.

Gerard made a motion to approve the vouchers in the amount of \$23,528.34 (Check #'s 38269-38297), to pay payroll and due bills and electronic payments in the amount of \$ 6,135.09. Second by Sunnarborg. Motion carried.

The mutual aid agreement between the Thomson Township-Esko Fire Department and the Cloquet Area Fire District (CAFD) has been reviewed by Pritchett. A motion was made by Janke with a second by Compo to approve the agreement. Motion carried.

A thank you was received from Esko Community Education for the Town's continued support of their programs.

Jeff Juntunen was present to update the Board on Fire Department activities and concerns. There is currently a Bill being proposed at the State Legislature which would increase funding for police and fire department pension plans. A motion was made by Compo with a second by Sunnarborg to approve Resolution # 13-04 which supports the efforts to pass HF # 857 and SF # 935 which would increase the funding to these pensions. Resolution approved.

Brad Scott from LHB was present to update the Board on the Safe Routes to Schools project. Discussion was held on the proposed parking lot entrances and possible changes that could be made. Scott will put together an alternate plan for the Board.

Juntunen inquired if any information had been obtained regarding the payments made to CAFD for the Town's ambulance service. It was confirmed that Thomson Township is still the only local government (not a member of the fire district) that is contributing to the ambulance service. When there is an ambulance call in Thomson Township, the fee for out of district service is then waived. This is \$256 per call. Kevin Schroeder, CAFD Chief, will be invited to the next Board meeting to continue the discussion.

February fund balances and February receipts in the amount of \$ 66,831.15 were reviewed.

Discussion was held on the hiring of a new janitor/building maintenance worker. The Personnel Committee will work on a job description to begin the process. A temporary employee will be hired to work until the position is filled permanently.

Janke reported that the Carlton County talent contest has been cancelled.

Janke, Peleski and Juntunen met with representatives from Midway Township to discuss the possibility of providing fire coverage to them. This will continue to be discussed.

Hill and Peleski reported on a recent meeting they attended at Cloquet City Hall. The meeting was held to renew discussions on how the area municipalities can work together to provide services to residents. The first areas that will be discussed are human resources and information technology. The next meeting will be held on April 11.

Sunnarborg reported that the road and bridge radios have been reprogrammed and can now be used. A new base unit will need to be purchased for the garage.

The financial reports for the Esko Hockey Association have been received for the year 2010. A motion was made by Compo with a second by Janke to approve the payment of \$ 3,150 to the hockey association for the year 2011. Motion carried.

Peleski will be working with the auditors from Wipfli, LLP for the annual financial audit for 2012.

A motion to adjourn was made at 7:50 p.m. by Sunnarborg with a second by Janke. Motion carried.

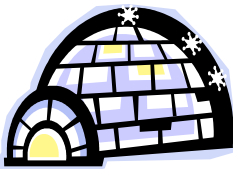
